

APPLICATION FOR A REPLACEMENT DEGREE CERTIFICATE AFTER GENDER AFFIRMATION

The University of Western Australia will issue a replacement certificate to graduates who have undergone a gender affirmation following their graduation.

To have your degree certificate(s) reissued in your new name, submit this completed application, along with the following:

- 1. Your current degree certificate, or a Statutory Declaration if the original degree certificate has been lost, stolen, or destroyed
- 2. Original documentary evidence of your gender affirmation, or certified photocopies signed by an authorised witness (only
- one of the below documents required):
 - o A statement from a Registered Medical Practitioner or a Registered Psychologist which specifies your gender; or
 - o A valid Australian Government travel document, such as a valid passport, which specifies your gender; or
 - o A state or territory birth certificate, which specifies your gender. A document from a state or territory Registrar of Birth
 - Deaths and Marriages recognising a change of sex and /or gender will also be seen as sufficient evidence.
- 3. Original documentary evidence of your change of name, or certified copies signed by an authorised witness

4. Photographic ID: a driver's license, passport, or proof of age card
